1. Approval of Minutes of Annual Assembly meeting – 10 May 2018

Cllr Mrs Turner proposed approval of the Minutes of the Annual Assembly meeting of 10 May 2018 which was seconded by Cllr Dunn and unanimously agreed.

- 2. Matters Arising
 - 1. The Eden's Hill signage had now been replaced.
 - 2. Cllr Mrs Fabian whose property was used as a signal transmission point for Voneus reported good strength of signal and was pleased with the improvement.
 - 3. Works at "The Steps" Cllr Dunn advised that he had visited the owners of the property and subsequently the parking of vehicles connected to the renovation work had moved and visibility/condition of verges had improved.
- 3. To receive questions from the public regarding the Council's activities during the financial year 2018/19 and any issues relating to parish matters
 - 3.1 A request was made for the 30 mph road marking at Eden's Hill to be repainted due to poor visibility. This to be reported to Glos County Council Highways Dept.
 - 3.2 A query was raised with regard to a link appearing not to work on the Parish Council website.
 - 3.3 A request was made for signage to be provided for locating the Village Hall. District Cllr Burford advised that County Cllr W Windsor-Clive held a small budget for such purchases and that if successful, the Highways authority would erect. It was agreed to pursue this.
 - 3.4 A request was made for a dog bin in the village. It was agreed to enquire if the District Council would regularly empty the bin and to ascertain the cost of purchasing a bin for consideration at the next meeting of the Council.
